
Log-in Information for Critical Care Symposium Wednesday, June 16, 2021

This document will show you how to log-in to participate in the Critical Care Symosium on June 16th.


- Go to https://ccs.umem.org
- Click on **EVENT PORTAL** on the top of the page.




• Type in your **EMAIL ADDRESS** as your **Username**, and the **password** you set during registration. The email should be the same email you receive all communications about the Critical Care Symposium.




• If you forgot your password, click on **Forgot Password** to reset. Make sure you put in the email address you used when you registered. It will then send you an email from **UMEM Events** with the subject line **[UMEM Events] Password Reset**. The email will include a password reset link.




You are now in the Event Portal. From this page, you will be able to view the LIVE event stream of

be able to access the Chat function and Q&A box for the live event.




- To chat and/or ask questions during the Symposium, you will need to open the chat function in the
 Event Portal. The chat box is located directly below the buttons to access the program schedule, list
 of speakers and faculty, etc.
- Look for the ••• (three dots), click on them and then select **Pop out**. This will allow you to open the chat box and still see the streaming video (see next page).


