Quick Instructions on How to Access the Emergency Cardiology Symposium 2026

- Go to ecs.umem.org
- Click on Log-In to the website.
- Once logged in, click on Emergency Cardiology Symposium.
- Then click on Event Portal.
- You will have access to all lectures in the Event Portal under Course Content.
- Watch the lectures (videos).
- Complete the post-lecture feedback surveys. You can do this in any order.
- Once you have completed all lectures and surveys, complete the Final Feedback for ECS 2026 at the bottom of the Event Portal under Course Content.

Completion requirements:

- Watch all 6 lectures.
- Complete all 6 post-lecture feedback surveys.
- Complete the Final Feedback for ECS 2026.
- For those who registered to get a Certificate of Participation (no CME):* Access the Assigned Group(s) to download your certificate.



You will need to log in to our website to participate. Even if you registered for the free option. Click on **Login** at the top right of the page.




How to Access the Emergency Cardiology Symposium 2026

Log in to the website using the email address you used for registration, and the password you set. Type in your **EMAIL ADDRESS** as your **Username**, and the password you set during registration. The email should be the same email you receive all communications about the Geriatric Emergency Medicine Symposium.





Once you have completed the final survey, click on CONTINUE to get you back to the Event Portal. Scroll down to the Assigned Group(s) section, and click on the group name.

This will open up to the page where you can download your certificate. If you click on the Assigned Group(s) before you have completed all the lectures and survey, it will show that you have not completed the course and the certificate will not be available.

Once you have completed it and are ready to download your certificate, click **DOWNLOAD CERTIFICATE**.

Frequently Asked Questions

What has changed about how I access the symposium?

For the first time, we are using our new learning management system (LMS) to provide access to our education. This will require people to log into the website, and then click on the event portal. The new LMS will track what lectures and surveys you have completed which will help with your planning and time management.

Do I still need to attend at a scheduled time?

No. All symposium lectures have been pre-recorded and uploaded to the learning platform. You can watch any session, at any time, from anywhere - whenever it best fits your schedule.

How long do I have access to the content?

Participants receive full access to all lectures and materials for a year. This gives you plenty of time to explore new topics, revisit sessions, or catch up on any lectures you didn't complete right away. We will also be working on posting lectures on our YouTube channel in the future.

Why is the symposium a self-paced format and not a live event?

We know how unpredictable emergency medicine schedules can be. The self-paced format is designed to give you maximum flexibility, allowing you to learn, review, and engage with the content at your convenience—without the pressure of attending on a single day.

How will I know if I completed all my lecture quizzes and surveys?
